Old Business

Update on insurance for WFP activities

for participants to sign? The Board needs to find out what National WFP would do for these types of events such as insurance policies, riders, waivers, etc... Eric will check into costs and with Chris and Patrick to have them check what National WFP does.

Awards clarification

Discussed that awards committee will fund all awards and coordinate with other committees. Eric suggests that Awards committee gets clarification from National and how their awards are sent out and how we know what has been sent out so we can present at the conference. Doug mentioned that this would be included in an SOP update at the retreat.

David mentioned there was some confusion on who would order the awards. Each committee will order awards and let Awards committee know who is receiving awards. The following is a list of awards presented: Water tasting, safety, cross connection, student activities, MAC best of show.

As it stands now, funding comes out of awards committee. Who takes care of ordering will be addressed at the summer retreat and update of the SOP

New Business

Committee Reports

Archives & History – No report.

Audit – Eric sent out a report. Budget amount is \$2,750 which is in the range of what has been provided by Micek and Crouch. Eric and Ben will be working on submittal of Audit. Paperwork has been signed to turn in.

Awards - No report.

Budget - See attachment. 2012 year end budget reviewed. 2013 budget presented for approval, Doug motion, Mary second, motion passed.

Eric asked about top ops \$1,000 reimbursement from the section, this is budgeted and reimbursement can be made to individuals. Ben to send out reimbursement expense forms to Mary, David, Eric, Steve Kelley. Ben will send a form to Brian to post to website.

Cross Connection – Rich provided a report and a backflow flyer was sent out, see attached. Dates and sites are set, still coming up with topics for the training workshops.

Education – John Keith submitted report, see attached. 13 events including MUD and scheduled for 7 more training events this fall. Safety first video purchased with bookstore allotment but not yet received. Ben did receive an invoice although we should not have. Mike Wentink to follow up.

John talked about pre-conference planning and need for rooms. Mike indicated we need to coordinate with conference center, pre-conference will be at Younes.

Fall Conference – David suggests discussion afterwards for detailed work. Quick summary – three party talks at Great Plains Conference was held. Need draft of presenters and presentations by July 15th, final draft Aug 15th, mailer mailed August 1st, and conference booklet by October 15th.

Concern about exhibitors, Tony is already addressed. Social hour will be moved up 1 hour as to not conflict with hotel social hour, will discontinue the operator breakfast, now need to pin down presentations. Eric suggests contacting Dewy Anderson – UNL drought expert.

David asked about Doug issues concerning small systems today – Doug mentioned that nitrate contamination is the largest issue as well as uranium, operations and management issues with new operators trying to implement changes but have difficulty convincing Boards to make changes (financial and capacity development issues). Proper and full implementation of cross connection and backflow program. Doug indicates lack of public education on the water system utility, it was suggested that Brian may have a presentation on how to market your system and value of the system.

Fall Conference planning session will be held after the Board meeting.

David asked Doug to send request for Fall Conference State Employee discount.

Eric recommends short session for NE WARN.

Doug will remind Jack Daniel that they want him to speak at the conference on Thursday for 1 hr.

Doug would like an hour for NDHHS field staff panel discussion.

Doug mentioned that he would talk to Howard Issacs about panel discussion for monitoring and compliance, David will look into schedule and get back to Doug.

Suggestions were made for presenters from EPA and Eric will contact National WARN (Kevin Morley).

Fuller Award – Mike and the committee have started.

MAC – Tony talked about fall conference revised vendor layout floor plan to improve traffic, will coordinate best of show. Invites will go out mid-August.

Membership – Marc submitted a 2013-2014 membership development plan. See attached. Need to promote the discount coupons for new members.

Nominations – Nominations need to be submitted to secretary by July meeting for trustee positions and then trustees moving up.

Publications – Brain submitted a publications report. David suggested adding a number of links be added to the web site. Brian is waiting from direction to the Board for approval to post on

the web site. Jim indicates that we need to be careful on the number of links for maintenance of those links as web sites changes, don't want to overburden Brian. Suggestion that vendors and firms who have links on the web site be charged for advertisement. Eric suggested move forward with public links and that this be further discussed at the retreat.

Brain needs content for Wise Water Words, Board encourages each committee to submit something.

Public Information – Mary indicates committee met last month. May 5-11 is drinking water week. Invitations were sent out to 40 mayors to issue a proclamation for drinking water week. National public service announcement from National has been posted to web site and media contacted to place on radio. Press releases sent to newpapers. Facebook page has 135 likes. Would like to host poster contest at Fall Conference for grade school children.

Last year and this year there was not a proclamation sent to the Governor, Doug suggests that AWWA be the organization that submits to the Governor. Mary indicates that the publication committee would take the lead on this.

Student Activities – No report.

Safety – No Report.

Scholarship – No Report.

Small Systems – Looking for a location to hold workshops, include drought, nitrate, and WARN content.

Water for People – See attached report. Golf tournament is postponed until May 24th at 1:00 pm. Other item on agenda discussed trap shoot and insurance, Eric is looking into this as indicated in Old Business.

Water Utility Council – Report submitted , see attached. Jim, Jerry, and Milo attended. Jim provided a summary of meetings. Went to Nebraska breakfast. Handed information to congretional staff with position papers. Senate staff for Fischer supported WIFIA. Others want to study information before committing. No representatives from NEWA present at fly-in.

Young Professionals – report submitted, refer to attached. A number of events were held, Diamond Plastics pipe plant tour, MUD Platte West WTP tour. Committee call held on April 25th.

May of 2013 YP will attend the Groundwater Festival in Grand Island. Committee is planning on other summer and fall YP tours. Planning on poker tournament at the Fall Conference.

RMSO – David scheduled to go but did not attend.

ACE attendees – Refer to information above.

September Board Meeting location update – Originally scheduled for Seward Community Center. This location will still work.

Membership Plan update – no further discussion.

Discussion on providing discount Fall Conference registrations for NHDDS employees was brought up. Tony is in support to doing something. Other organizations were not too receptive to the idea so discounts will need to go against NS AWWA. Eric again stressed that committee chairs should be submitting content.
