A. AWWA/ASCE/EWB-USA - Alliance

AWWA members have the opportunity to participate in an exciting new program called Engineering For US. This is a domestic program initiated by an alliance between AWWA, the American Society of Civil Engineers, and Engineers Without Borders USA. These organizations wish to create a larger collaboration in which underserved communities in the United States have access to the technical expertise required to facilitate infrastructure projects to improve their quality of life. In addition, this alliance will create a cadre of engaged members who have access to a quality assurance / quality control system and educational resources to ensure these projects are done in a manner which is appropriate in the regulatory environment within the United States.

Mission – Bringing communities and engineering leaders together to advance local infrastructure solutions.

Vision – The partnership's vision is a country where underserved communities have access to the technical expertise required to ensure the infrastructure capacity to meet their needs.

Alignment with AWWA Strategic Plan – Elements of this alliance and program fit within all four of AWWA's 2013 strategic goals. Most significantly, this program will create opportunities for membership engagement and organizational stewardship. Members will have the opportunity to work together to improve conditions in underserved communities, and as these projects address a range of infrastructure needs, both the investment in total water solutions and the resources available to the Association will grow.

B. India Initiative

For six years, AWWA has been actively attending and participating in meetings in India, primarily the attendance at the India Water Works Association (IWWA) meeting. In addition, AWWA gave IWWA permission for 24 standards to be printed and sold in India. The results of the relationship with IWWA have not met AWWA's expectations. In November 2013 AWWA conducted an exploratory trip to India to determine the viability of opening an AWWA office in India. The trip included meeting with approximately 150 water professionals over the course of 10 days. Through research, the development of the attached business case and the exploratory trip findings the major needs of the India water sector in India are:

Maintenance of infrastructure and delivery systems;

Water availability;

Contamination of water sources

Water loss due to poorly maintained and controlled infrastructure and theft; and Training of management and operators

As outlined more completely in the attached business case AWWA has several opportunities and challenges if it elects to establish an office in India. Among the opportunities is the fact that AWWA's brand is well recognized, AWWA's manuals of Practice and standards are already used and that there is a small group of passionate AWWA members in India. There are also many challenges and risks. Chief among those are: the geographical distance between AWWA and India, a lack of proven "in-country" membership model, the bureaucracy of the India's

and India, a lack of proven "in-country" membership model, the bureaucracy of the India's government and concern about utility affordability and travel limitations.

Miscellaneous Discussion - Value of Water

The Value of Water Campaign continues to remain at the forefront of Association led activities. About an hour or more of time was dedicated to talking about the level of support that could be provided as well as the best means to convey the message in the years and decades ahead. "The Value of Water Coalition is made up of both public and private members of the water industry, who have come together at a time when our water infrastructure is at risk. We aim to educate the public on the importance of clean, safe, and reliable water to and from every home and community, and to help ensure quality water service for future generations." A straw poll suggested that most of the attendees are willing to get behind some type of financing mechanism to further support the effort and push the goals and objectives deeper into the fabric of communities at large.

Overall, Funds raised by the Nebraska Section increased by 7% in 2013. Total funds raised, however, were down by 33% due to (1) a lack of matching funds often provided by Water for People, and (2) the Young Professionals Poker Tournament gives to Water for People bi-annually, alternating with Engineers Without Borders. This year, funds went to EWB.

<u>Golf Outing</u>: Coordinated by Patrick Harlan, and despite a weather reschedule, the golf outing increased funds raised by 16% over 2012. Originally, we had 92 golfers, but with the weather delay, we had only 72 golfers.

<u>Trap Shoot:</u> Coordinated by Tim Mundorf, funds raised from the trap shoot were down only 4% despite the new \$300 premium for event insurance. Attendance was up 30%.

<u>Raffle:</u> Funds raised were down by 15% vs. 2012 due to reduced ticket sales (-8%), and expenses were up. Ticket costs were up by 17%, bank fees increased and we printed a poster for advertising.

2014:

This appears to be a good location for both Lincoln and Omaha members, and it is a five-star golf course.
