

# Colonel Theodore A Leisen Memorial Education and Training Endowment Fund

- Colonel Theodore Alfred Leisen was one of the incorporators of AWWA and served as president from 1917-1918. He chaired several national committees on public health and pollution. Leisen was named general manager of the Metropolitan Utilities District (M.U.D.), Omaha, NE, in 1923 at age 59.
- The Nebraska Section American Water Works Association (AWWA) established the Colonel Theodore A. Leisen Memorial and Training Endowment Fund in 1993 to encourage water industry professionals to obtain additional training and encourage graduate and undergraduate students to choose the water industry as their field of work.
