AWWA Legislative Affairs Provided Summary on Buy America

In April, the White House released the Buy America Guidance. The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) passed in late 2021 prompted this guidance and, by May 14 2022, federal agencies awarding funds for infrastructure projects will enact Buy America preferences in the terms and conditions. The Buy America Guidance applies to all federal funds for infrastructure projects, not just those provided for in the IIJA, even if the project is not primarily or solely funded by federal funds. Water and wastewater projects are subject to this guidance which applies to the iron and steel, manufactured products, and construction materials used. Three types of waivers will be available for use, which will be subject to public comment and review as well as approval by the federal agency awarding funds.

Incoming Chair and Fall Conference Update, Board Meeting

Logistics are being discussed to see how SWANA can be included. Kathleen Alexander reported she is working with Younes Conference Center to make space for SWANA.

Fall Conference activities for the 75th anniversary are being planned with the first activity being a social at the Heartland Conference. NSAWWA plans to sponsor part of the social and is working on how to prepare for that.

Some proposed 75th anniversary activities are:

July 21 – Heartland (NWEA) conference social sponsorship

September 16 - WFP sporting clays

Nebraska Section AWWA Top Ops Committee Report May, 2022

AQs discussed at the March NSAWWA Board meeting, confirmation of Top Op Teams prior to the competition at the annual conference is a primary objective of the Committee this year. Also discussed at the meeting is the distribution of "gas" cards to those Top Op competitors. A shift has been made to the distribution of gift cards (Visa or such) for a cash amount in lieu of "gas" (fuel) cards. In speaking with one PWS source of competitors, that would have more applicability at the going and future rate of fuel cost.

Plan is to hit the NSAWWA members with an email blast regarding the Top Ops competition at the Fall conference and collect a goal of eight teams (3-person teams).

Marketing the competition with the added "carrot" of gift cards to competitors is essential. Plan to begin during the summer months after the timeframe for the actual competition is established. \$25.00 Gift cards will be distributed at competition time to those team members who compete. The 2023 ACE is in Toronto CA.

Top Ops at ACE allows teams of one, two or three (Eligibility Rules below). Three-person teams has been a mainstay at the Fall Conference and are much preferred. Depending on what we have for team entries, teams at the Fall Conference may consist of one, two, or three person teams.

At the local level, the eligibility (operator, member or other) to compete should not be restrained. Eligibility to compete at ACE and teams sponsored by the Section however is obviously another matter.

ACE 2022 Top Ops Eligibility Rules

ELIGIBILITY & MEMBERSHIP

- 7. Teams of one (1), two (2), or three (3) water operators from AWWA Sections are invited to compete.
- **8.** Each AWWA Section, including Multi-State Provincial Sections may enter one (1) team in the AWWA ACE Top Ops Competition. The ACE local host Section is permitted to send up to two (2) teams. The Section with the returning champion team is permitted to send one (1) additional team, up to a total of two (2). If the ACE Local Host Section also has the returning champion, they are permitted to send a total of three (3) teams.
- **9.** Each AWWA Top Ops Competition participant must be a current AWWA member from the time of registration through the ACE event. This membership may be an individual membership, or the participant can be a regular employee of an AWWA Utility Member. Each Section is responsible for verifying the membership status of each participant before entering them into the competition.
- **10.** Only AWWA Section teams that have qualified by competing in a Section Top Ops competition are allowed to enter the AWWA ACE Top Ops Competition. If there are not enough teams for a Section to hold a Top Ops competition at the Section level, a team may enter the AWWA Top Ops competition with approval from the Section that they are representing.
- 11. A team must consist of the same individuals throughout the entire AWWA ACE Top Ops

Competition, but the team members need not be employees of the same organization or utility. May T O

12. All team members must satisfy the following eligibility requirements:

- a. They must work full-time as a water treatment plant employee or a water distribution system employee. At least 50% of their time must be as a water treatment plant employee or a water distribution employee.
- b. They must possess a valid water operator, laboratory, and/or distribution certificate for their jurisdiction. Any Section-level contestants who do not hold this certification may not participate at the Association level.
- c. Only individuals whose primary day-to-day job functions include hands-on operational tasks within the water utility or distribution system are eligible to compete. Teams may not include anyone with a more senior job function than a first line (fore person) supervisor. Engineers are not allowed to compete unless they are working as a full-time operator.
